1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 This rally will be run in compliance with the General Competition Rules (GCR's) and the Standing Supplementary Regulations (SSR's) and Appendices of Motorsport South Africa, these event Supplementary Regulations (SR's), the 2018 Northern Regions and any relevant Circulars. Modifications, amendments and / or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated bulletins, issued by the organiser or the Stewards. Also refer to all applicable MSA Rally Circulars. The event will be open to competitors that hold valid MSA licences, - who is domiciled within the areas under the jurisdiction of the MSA.

Please book and pay well in advance for any additional meal tickets for prize giving. No tickets will be on sale at the venue.

- The Club reserves the right to subsidize entry fees when possible
- The entry fee will be refunded in full to candidates whose entry has not been accepted or in the case of the Rally not taking place.
- 4.4 Late entries are defined as:
 - a) Telephonic entries,
 - b) Entries not accompanied by an entry fee,
 - c) Entries received after closing date
- 4.5 The minimum MSA license requirements are:

R2N - MSA National License

Classic - MSA Regional License

Open Class - MSA Club License

Northern Regions - MSA Club License

- 4.6 The Organizers reserve the right to cancel the event if less than 10 paid entries are received by *Friday 19 October 2018*.
- 4.7 Entry Limit: **50** If more than 50 entries have been received by close of entries,
- 4.8 Proof of competition license for Drivers and Navigators must be submitted via e-mail to Henriette Jooste samrallies@mweb.co.za
- 4.9 Crew Changes
 Refer to GCR 152(viii)
- 4.10 Refusal of entry Refer to GRC 99 & GCR 100











4.11 Organiser's Insurance

The entry fees include the insurance premium to insure the competitors and other parties as necessary against third party risks whilst taking part in such parts of the Rally on private lands or roads. The liability provided under this special insurance is R50 million covering any one incident or accident.

Entrants understand that they are liable for an excess fee of R25,000 for each and every claim, except for spreading a fire, excess will be R50,000.

4.12 After the entry list has been finalized, a crew may substitute one car for another but may not change the starting order except for reasons of safety only.

5. RECONNAISANCE

- 5.1 Competitors wishing to participate in the Recce, must notify the organisers by no later than Tuesday, 23 October at 19h00 to Henriette Jooste at samrallies@mweb.co.za
- 5.2 Sign on will be at Ermelo Show Grounds Rally Headquarters on Friday 26 October 2018
- 5.3 A Recce schedule will be published after close of recce registration.
- 5.4 Crews will be limited to a single pass of the prescribed route and sequence as per the schedule.

6. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

- 6.1 At administrative checks the following documents will be checked, and entry form details verified:
 - Crews-, Entrant's-, MSA competition- and Provincial licenses
 - Correctness of all other information given on the entry form
 - Online Entry forms must be signed by crew members
 - Medical questionnaires must be completed beforehand and submitted to the NRC.
- 6.2 On event contactable cell phone numbers for both crew members and the Service manager OR CREW must be provided. (Not next of kin in another town)

6.3 NO COMPETITION LICENCES WILL BE ISSUED AT THE EVENT.

Competitors must obtain their annual MSA license from MSA prior to the event.

- A minimum of Club status is required.
- This applies to both the driver and the navigator.
- Entries will not be accepted unless proof of license is attached.

7. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

- 7.1 A representative from the team may do the Scrutineering. Please ensure all safety equipment is presented Competitors helmets, FIA approved Front Head Restraint (Optional for Club Rally) and flame-resistant clothing will be checked at scrutineering.
- 7.2 Scrutineering will take place at Ermelo Show Grounds on Thursday 25th October 2018
- 7.3 The Self Scrutineering form will need to be printed and completed before arriving by a crew member.
- 7.4 It is the competitor's responsibility to obtain a signed scrutineering sticker from the Scrutineers. No car will be allowed to start without a signed scrutineering form.











- 7.5 The organizers reserve the right to have the cars stripped post-race if deemed necessary. Alternatively, the organizers reserve the right to impound / or seal the vehicles after the event for inspection without prior warning or reasons given.
- 7.6 Windscreen and Class decals will be available on the event from the scrutineer at a cost of R120-00 per Windscreen Decal and R60-00 per set of Class Decals

8. COMPETITION NUMBERS AND ADVERTISING

- 8.1 Refer SSR 193.9 and SSR 193.10.
- 8.2 The decals as per diagram below are compulsory for all competitors.
- 8.3 Replacement class decals can be bought from the Rally Secretary on arrangement prior to the event. Class decals @R180-00 per set (set = 2x door, 1x windscreen)
- 8.4 National Classes NRC Windscreen decal is compulsory @R120-00 additional.
- 8.5 A decal check will be done at scrutineering and non-compliance will be penalized.
- 8.6 It is highly recommended that the Driver's name appears on top on both rear windows.



9. TYRES

Tyres specified for use during the rally.

Only tyres complying with MSA Regulations may be used during the event.

Refer SSR 193 Art 6, Applicable to the National Championship only.

Refer SSR Part 5: 4.24 for Classic Class cars and SSR Part 5: 5.19 for Open Class cars.

10. START PROCEDURES

Start order and Intervals

10.1 Start positions on day one will be determined as follows:

R2N cars will start according to the top 7 rotation system;

Classic cars and Open Class cars will start behind R2N cars;

Regional cars will start behind National cars;

2-minute intervals will be applied to each category, however extra time gaps may be applied between categories for safety at the sole discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

The Clerk of the Course may change the starting order on grounds of safety.











10.2 Start positions on day Two will be determined as follows:

The top 7 R2N crews as per Day1 result will start first on the road in their sequence. The remaining crews will fill from position 8 to the last car in their correct sequence. If the Clerk of the Course deems a faster car to be in the wrong starting position based on seeding, such crew(s) may be moved up the field based on grounds of safety. The Clerk of the Course may impose a bigger time gap after the leading top 7 and remaining field.

10.3 The starting order will be determined by the organizers of the event referring to the driver's seeding on the NRC and Northern Regions Seeding List.

11. SERVICE CREWS

- 11.1 As service crews are clearly connected with the rally, competitors are asked to ensure that their crews obey all traffic regulations, especially in built-up areas. Refer SSRs 193.11 and SSR 173.
- 11.2 Servicing is only permitted:
 - a) in designated service areas.
 - b) Any area so designated by the Clerk of the Course and as indicated on the route schedule. Competitors and their Service Crews are advised to familiarize themselves with MSA Environmental Code in the current MSA Handbook.
 - c) Competitors are to ensure that their Service Crews have Fire Extinguishers visible and accessible at all times where servicing or refueling is taking place. Failure to do so will result in penalties being imposed at the discretion of the Stewards

12. JUDGES OF FACT

Judges of Fact may be appointed to observe certain stages to eliminate any possible short cutting of the route. These officials will be named and posted on the Notice Board at Rally HQ.

13. ALCOHOL

It is forbidden for any competitor or members of their crew to consume alcohol while taking part in an event, or in the time period between the competitor completing the event and lodging an official protest. (GCR118).

14. <u>TIME CARDS AND INCIDENT REPORT F</u>ORMS

A crew breaking down in a stage must please take note that it is prohibited to remove their car before the Sweep Car has picked up their fully completed Incident Report forms and Time Cards (if completely retiring).

SSR 193.17.7 refers. A penalty may be imposed on the crew who does not hand in their Time Cards and Incident Report Form after withdrawal of the event or completion of the event.

15. ABANDONED CARS

No cars are to be left in a stage unattended. One or both crew members must remain with the car until it is collected by the service crew or by other means. A penalty of R500.00 may be imposed on any crew who contravenes this clause. The Organizers will have response vehicles on standby to assist with competitor safety at night.

16. **SUPER RALLY**

Super Rally will be allowed. If a competitor breaks down, and is able to continue, such a crew may rejoin the rally after a designated Service time, with the permission of the Clerk of the Course. The event will be split into 3 sections – the Clerk of the Course to advise the splits before the rally start via a Bulletin.











17. UNREALISTIC STAGE TIMES

The Clerk of the Course may, at his sole discretion, adjust any stage time he considers unrealistic and the offending crew will be afforded a time, 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest car in the same class, or if the offending crew is the only car in the class, 10 sec/km or part thereof slower than the fastest crew in the next class lower.

18. OTHER PROCEDURES

18.1 Organization Assistance

The Organiser may ask local individuals from the area to assist in attaining permission from landowners as well as use of their land. Such individuals could include competitors. The Organiser waive any supposedly advantage gained in assisting by organising this event by fact of a non-compulsory reconnaissance which is available to all competitors.

18.2 Testing

All crews to note that NO testing on any roads used for the rally will be allowed, effective from 4 weeks prior to the event. Any team found to have contravened this rule will be subject to exclusion from the event. Refer SSR 193.8.2.2

18.3 Permitted early check in

Crews may report before their due time at the following time controls:

- Parc Ferme in at the end of day 1 and end of the rally.
- Crews must nominate their book in time.
- 18.4 Official time used during the rally

The official time during the rally will be GPS time (offset to local time).

- 18.5 Rally time clocks will be used for recording stage times.
- 18.6 Final Parc Ferme

All cars may be removed from the final Parc Ferme, providing the results have become final and the CoC in consultation with the Technical Delegate have authorized the Parc Ferme to be opened.

18.7 Penalties

Refer SSR's 172 to 196 of the MSA handbook.

18.8 Protests

Refer SSR 193.24 and GCR's 197 to 207 of the 2018 MSA handbook.

- 18.9 Postponement, Abandonment or cancellation of event Refer to GCR 244.
- 18.10 Impossible Times

18.11 Refuel

You may NOT refuel in Service Park. A Refuel Zone will apply.

Environmental mats are required.

Fire extinguishers as per SSR 193.12.3

18.12 Prize Giving

An official Prize Giving will commence @ Ermelo Show Grounds on Saturday 27th October. Final time will be published in the final Instructions.

The prize giving function will be open to all involved in the rally.

18.13 Road Books

In order to save costs and the environment, traditional road books will not be distributed to competitors. All officials will have a copy of the road books and competitors may download them directly from www.sarally.co.za if they should require a copy. All liaison sections will be published beforehand for competitors to download.











18.14 Safety Plan

A detailed safety plan will be published beforehand for crews to print and have available on the event in their vehicles.

19. PRIZES

19.1 Podium Procedure

A podium celebration will be held as soon as the last car has finished the event based on unofficial results available at the time.

The aim of the podium celebration is for champagne spray for TV and public display purposes. Any disputes should be handled accordingly at Rally Headquarters as soon as a competitor finishes their race, not publicly at the podium.

The Order of the podium will be as follows:

- 1) Regional top 3
- 2) Open Class top 3
- 3) Classic Class top 3
- 4) R2N Class top 3
- 5) Ermelo National Rally Overall top 3 (if different from a class podium)

 This will be a champagne spray only, trophies to be handed at the Prize Giving function.

The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to change the podium procedures if he / she deems it necessary to do so.

Podium to be at the finish of the event at approximately 16h30 on Saturday, 27 October followed by a prize giving
