# 4. EVENT AND STATUS:

The event will be known as the *T Bone Racing Junior Enduro Interprovincial Challenge – Round 5 and 6* will be an interprovincial and club event between riders from various provinces. Venue is situated at Matatiele Country Club.


11. CLASSES:	
Junior 50cc motorcycles (Club Class)	Open to competitors from the year of their 5th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs.
Club Junior 65cc	Open to competitors from the year of their 7th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.
Junior 65cc motorcycles (Interprovincial Challenge Class)	Open to competitors from the year of their 7th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 12th birthday occurs.
Club Junior 85cc	Open to competitors from the year of their 7th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.
Junior 85cc motorcycles (Interprovincial Challenge Class)	Open to competitors from the year of their 9th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.
Senior 85cc motorcycles (Interprovincial Challenge Class)	Open to competitors from the year of their 13th birthday, to 31st December of the year in which their 15th birthday occurs.

A rider must be mobile with his motorcycle and cross the finish line, on his last lap regardless of the minimum number of laps he is required to complete, to be regarded as a finisher. The racing time may be shortened at the discretion of the COC where the time gap between first and second rider is such that the  $2^{nd}$  rider would be time barred from continuing, as the race time had elapsed. Riders will be scored according to the number of laps completed in the lowest net time after addition of any penalties.

12. GENERAL RACE INFORMATION:	
DOCUMENTATION AND SCRUTINEERING:	Refer to Programme of Events in point 5 above. A self- scrutineering form is available on the website and must be completed, signed and handed in to race organisers prior to the start of the event. Random scrutineering will be conducted before, during or after the event to test the accuracy of the information on the scrutineering form – ART 15 a) in the 2018 MSA SA National Enduro SSR's.

FINISH AND ROUTE CHECK CONTROL CARDS:	If route cards, or helmet stickers are issued, they must be returned when completing incident report forms. Incorrectly marked route cards or helmet stickers will lead to time penalty. If rider does not finish their last lap, a DNF will be issued.	
SWEEPS AND RECOVERY:	Sweeping starts directly after cut-off.	
RESULTS:	Provisional results will be displayed at race control as soon as possible after final rider finishes their race. This will become final after 30 minutes. Protests concerning the results of any race must be received by the Clerk of the Course within 30 minutes o the posting of the provisional results. Refer GCR 200 (viii)	
TROPHIES / AWARDS:	Awards will be made 1 <sup>st</sup> to 3 <sup>rd</sup> in each class.	







ROUTE/EVENT DESCRIPTION:	50cc	Approx 4km route with a 1H:30min race period. Fully spectator accessible.
	65cc & 85cc	The route may be covered more than three times. The course will be approximately 40km - 50km long in total for leading riders and app. 2 hour race period.
START ORDER:	As per the championship standings for the T Bone Racing Junior Enduro Series. Riders that did not finish Ixopo Enduro, or new riders will be placed in positions on the start grid that match skills levels so as to avoid bottlenecks and dangerous passing. This position will be approximately 6 positions back from their actual positions so as to give the riders that have participated at previous the advantage they have earned. In the combined 65cc / 85cc class, riders will start as per skill level, at the discretion of the race organisers.	
ROAD CROSSINGS:	<ul> <li>Where the route of an event crosses a public road <ul> <li>a) All competitors must come to a complete standstill (wheels not turning and the vehicle not in motion)</li> <li>b) Stop warning signs advising of the crossing will be posted before the crossing (the nature of the terrain to be taken into consideration) alternatively a cordoned off funnel area or any such route control will serve as adequate notification of such impending road crossing.</li> <li>c) Stop signs will be placed immediately before the crossing.</li> <li>d) FAILURE TO STOP – with a foot on the ground – will result in a 30 minute penalty.</li> <li>It is the rider's responsibility to execute a STOP. It is not the responsibility of the Organisers or Officials to ensure a STOP is executed. The onus rests with the rider to prove that he has / had stopped. Refer ART 20 in the</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

RETIREMENT AND EVALUATION REPORT FORMS:	Refer to ART 27 in the 2018 MSA SA National Enduro SSR's. A fine of R250 will be awarded where an evaluation (incident) report form is not completed within 1 hour of the rider completing the race or choosing not to continue racing. If rider would like to retire but still get a finish, rider can wait in the park ferme area until chequered flag is waved for the first time.
REFRESHMENTS:	Refreshments and food will be on sale at the restaurant at the club house.
POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT OR CANCELLATION:	The Organisers reserve the right to cancel the event if less than 50 entries have been received by the closing date. The Organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the meeting or any part thereof. In the event of any of the above, the Competitor/Entrant has no right to claim against the Promoter/Organiser in respect of any loss or damage he/she may incur, other than that specified in GCR 244. The meeting will not be postponed, abandoned or cancelled without the consent of the MSA Steward in accordance with GCR 152.
ADVERTISING:	

It is condition of entry that in addition to the advertising referred to in GCR 246, competing motorcycles shall also display the advertising, if any, as stipulated in the Championship and specifications for the class for which the motorcycle is entered.

In the event of a tie at the end of the season, the competitor with the greatest number of class wins will be declared the winner. If this does not resolve the tie then the greatest number of seconds will count, failing that then thirds and so forth.

### 14. PROTESTS:

All protests and appeals will be dealt with as set out in 2018 GCR Appendix R, Parts IX and X.

#### 15. ELECTRONIC TIMING:

Race Control will be timing using an electronic timing method. ALL TRANSPONDERS WILL BE RETURNED WITH INCIDENT REPORT FORMS AND HELMET STICKERS (IF APPLICABLE) at the end of the race.

### 16. RIGHTS OF THE CLERK OF COURSE:

The Clerk of the Course and/or the Steward of the Meeting have the right to call a halt to an event due to "force majeure" for any of the following, but not limited to, reasons:

- i. Extreme weather conditions
- ii. Serious or fatal accident
- iii. Sections of the route being deemed impassable owing to recent extreme weather or other unforeseen circumstances.
- iv. Dangerous circumstances for riders involving spectators or bystanders.
- v. Any other circumstances which the Clerk of the Course, in his sole discretion, deems to be dangerous or prejudicial to competitors.
- vi. In the event of an event being halted as above or for any other reason, the Clerk of the Course will inform all marshal points to stop competitors. The riders will be scored back to the last timing point they passed before the event was stopped.
- vii.The COC will have the right to stop a competitor from further competing at any event for safety or medical reasons. Time compensation, if held up unnecessarily, will be afforded to the effected rider by the COC, at his discretion Refer SSR 323 in the 2018 MSA SA National Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads SSR's and ART 25 b) (iv) in the 2018 MSA SA National Enduro SSR's.

### 17. CROSSING OF PUBLIC /DISTRICT ROADS:

As the organizer we have fully acquainted ourselves with ART 20 in the 2018 MSA SA National Enduro SSR's.

We the organizers are also aware and have acquainted ourselves with the provisions of Section 317 of the Road Traffic Act and confirm that the event officials have been made aware of the above section. By allowing the event to proceed we accept that all requirements are complied with and where applicable all relevant permissions are in place.

#### 18. GENERAL:

LICENCES:

Competitors are only permitted to compete at this event with the following Motorsport South Africa licences:

• 2018 MSA Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads or Enduro licence – regional (65cc and 85cc IPC





classes)

- 2018 MSA Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads or Enduro licence club (50cc, Club Junior 65cc and Club Junior 85cc, High School and Ladies classes)
- 2018 MSA WOW One event and WOW Annual licence For WOW Classes only.

(The above is for insurance and public liability reasons, and competitors will be denied entry failing possession thereof).

A WOW licence holder may compete, but may not score points in that particular race and will only be permitted to compete for a minimum of 50% of the full race distance, with no trophies/prizes, except a finishers medal.

-All parents and support crew are requested to have a general understanding of the 2018 MSA SA National Enduro and Cross Country Motorcycle & Quad SSR's.

-The safety plan will be available at Race Control and will be available from the race secretary, as per the requirements of THE SAFETY & RECREATION ACT 2 of 2010.

### -Every pit is required to have a Fire Extinguisher of at least 2.5kg capacity.

-Every rider is required to use an Environmental Mat when refuelling

	d)	Riders not maintaining their allotted position on the starting grid or displacing other riders on the starting grid, will incur penalties should the Clerk of the Course deem this necessary.
	e)	Failing to refuel on an environmental mat – 30 minutes.
	f)	Failing to have a 2.5kg fire extinguisher in the pits – 30 minutes.
	g)	Failure to hand in an incident report form within 30 minutes of finishing – 15 minute penalty.
	h)	Failure to hand in an incident report form within 30 minutes of withdrawing from an event – R200 fine
	i)	If a competitor returns an unrealistically fast lap time and it is obvious that that competitor has deviated from the route, thereby gaining a time advantage over other competitors he / she will be penalised 30 minutes per occurrence plus the estimated time advantage gained by the deviation/s.
	j)	Failure to stop at a road crossing with a foot on the ground – 30 minutes.
	k)	Any act by a rider or his crew, that is considered to be prejudicial to the environment, will result in exclusion.

Motorcycle & Quad Regulations.

Rider conduct - Refer to SSR 347 in the 2017 MSA National Cross Country

Any rider found riding a motorcycle without a helmet on (includes

parents, pit crew, mechanic and visitor) will cause the related competitor to be penalised 30 minutes. n) Any rider receiving tools and spares outside the specially demarcated pit area, other than from another competing competitor or official will incur a 30 minute penalty. 0) Outside assistance is only allowed by spectators and riders when rider being assisted is in distress or harm is imminent. Any member of the rider's crew and support team drinking alcohol or p) smoking in the pits can result in total exclusion for their rider. All riders and parents are to familiarize themselves with the current q) versions of the MSA handbooks which include the general regulations applicable to race meetings. Any parent not acting in the best interest of their child racing at any event, will cause their child to be excluded from the results and/or refused to continue with the race after such incident and may be banned from competing in future events – Refer SSR 347 f) & 352g) (xxviii) in the 2018 MSA SA National Cross Country Motorcycles & Quads SSR's. The T Bone Racing organisers reserves the right to withhold any child's entry (in accordance with GCR 99) due to bad conduct of the parents. No abuse of any riders by parents or other riders is allowed at any time. The aim of the club is to provide a fun riding environment for all. No foul language is permitted by any persons at the track. No abuse of any officials, organizers or peers is allowed on a race day for any reason whatsoever. No "gossiping" or "bad-mouthing" of the organisers, the event, proceedings or any riders will be tolerated before, during or after an event. There is an open-door policy of communication between event organisers and parents for any issues whatsoever, and approaching an issue in any way other than constructive communication brings the sport into disrepute and will result in exclusion of that rider going forward. If any penalties or exclusions are applied, all possible steps must be taken r) to inform the competitor(s), prior to the posting of provisional results. The penalty for speeding in the pit lane (exceeding idling pace) is one s) minute – Refer ART. 22 n) & ART 39 a) (v) in the 2018 MSA SA National Enduro SSR's. Refer ART 17 in the 2018 MSA SA National Enduro SSR's. t) Marshalling of your own child's race (other than static marshalling) is u) forbidden, unless expressly in writing from the organisers before the event.
